What does it mean to be an eMentor?

eMentoring is a great opportunity to help someone, generally students or young alumni, by sharing your experiences and expertise via an online platform. The specific shape of the relationship is up to you and can range from just giving them advice online to eventually taking a phone call, or even inviting them to see where you work. It is a rewarding experience that generally results in personal growth for the mentor as well as the mentee.

What level of commitment is there?

The amount of time you spend will depend on you and your mentees' objectives as well as your schedules.
